





Financials



2018 Summary

- The gathering had a gain of \$4800, up from \$3600 in 2017.
- The additional grants from the county and cities of \$15000 is not in our financials for 2018. As planned, it was used as a down payment for Diamond Rio in our 2019 budget.
- Zion Bank dropped their sponsorship in 2018, resulting in a \$10000 overall sponsorships decline. Zion Bank has gone from \$40,000 to \$0 in 5 years.
- The sponsorship reduction was offset by additional grants and ticket revenue, primarily price.
- Number of tickets sold was up slightly in 2018, a positive trend started in 2017.

2019 Gathering and Beyond

Major areas of emphasis going forward:

- Currently our 2019 budget reflects a loss of ~\$6,000 driven by Entertainers. Entertainment expense is up \$35,000, partially offset by the additional county and cities grant of \$15,000 and anticipated ticket revenue increase of \$10,000.
- Ticket pricing for Diamond Rio is significantly higher than previous entertainers, \$75 for VIP. This should give us an indication of appeal to next gen entertainment for the gathering.
- Sponsorships trend need to be reversed. We now have an individual on the Board who is responsible for Sponsorships, i.e. Richard Boulter
- We are also looking to add expertise for Grants to the Board.
