RE: Voting Method for 2019 Municipal Election

Midway City needs to decide which voting method it will use for its 2019 election. State law allows the following methods:

- Instant Runoff or Ranked Voting The voter ranks the candidates for office. The candidates
 with the highest rankings fill the open offices. There is no primary election. This is a pilot
 program in the State and the deadline to opt into it has passed. Only two cities are using this
 option and I would recommend against it until its effectiveness had been determined after
 several election.
- In-Person Voting Most register voters do not receive a ballot in the mail and vote in person on the day of the election. State law requires in-person early voting be available for the two weeks prior to the election. Absentee ballots are mailed to individuals that request it such a deployed member of the military whose primary residence is in Midway.
- Voting by Mail All registered voters receive a ballot in the mail. State law also requires an inperson voting location on the day of the election and in-person early voting. This is the method
 used by Wasatch County. Although this method is significantly more expensive than in-person
 voting, I recommend it because of consistency, voter convenience and increased voter
 participation.

I am working with vendors to determine the approximate cost for each option. I will present those costs at the regular council meeting on April 23rd.
