## Q9: How can an individual nominate another individual as a candidate?



The individual must file a petition in person during the declaration period. Due to a legislative change in 2018, the petition does not have a required format, and only one signature is required. Refer to Utah Code 20A-9-203(3)(c).



Read the constitutional and statutory qualifications for the office and require the individual filing the petition to state whether the nominated candidate meets the qualifications. Utah Code 20A-9-203(4)(a)(ii). If the individual filing the petition states that the candidate meets the qualifications, accept the petition nomination. Refer to <u>Utah Code 20A-9-203(4)(c)(v)</u>.

(If applicable) If your municipality has an ordinance that establishes a filing fee, collect payment from the individual filing the petition. Refer to Utah Code 20A-9-203(3)(a)(ii).



Provide the nominated candidate with the information outlined in Q5. Please note that a nominated candidate is not required to complete a declaration of candidacy form.

If an individual has been nominated and does not want to run for office, she or he may withdraw by submitting a written affidavit with your office. Refer to <u>Utah Code 20A-9-203(11)</u>.

## Q10: Does a town or city council candidate need to declare for a specific seat?

It depends. A candidate will need to declare for a specific city/town council seat if (1) your municipality elects council members by districts, and/or (2) there is a four-year seat and two-year seat up for election at the same time. If the candidate fails to designate between the four-year seat or two-year seat, you must consider the declaration to be for the four-year seat. Refer to Utah Code 20A-9-203(6).

If neither of these situations apply to your municipality, candidates do not declare for a specific council seat. The ballot will feature all city council candidates, and voters are provided the option to vote for their top two or three choices (depending on the number of open seats).

## Q11: Can a candidate amend her or his declaration of candidacy?

Yes, a candidate may amend her or his declaration of candidacy before the filing period ends. They may not amend it after this time. Refer to Utah Code 20A-9-203(9).
