RE: Request for CARES funds

The State of Utah allocated \$475,482, of its CARES funds, to Midway City. They will release this money in three distributions (\$158,494 each). They are releasing the first distribution and told us that we can apply for the second distribution. They are holding the third distribution in case they need it on a state level. All funds must be expended by 30 November 2020.

I have been unable to determine if the first distribution has been put into our account because the City Treasurer is out of the office this week. I will verify the deposit on Monday (14 September 2020).

Please note that the money can only be used for “necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID–19)”. The recipient or any subgrantees must “retain documentation related to any uses of the funds, including but not limited to invoices, sales receipts, and payroll expenditures”.

The Wasatch County Fire District has requested approximately \$95,000 of Midway’s CARES funds for the purchase of a transport van. I have attached their request. I have also attached an email from Wasatch County indicating the CARES funds they have provided to the District.

Midway Mayor and City Council Members,

Wasatch Fire District would like to reach out to you regarding the CARES grant funding that Midway City has applied for. We would like to request assistance in purchasing a transport ambulance for the District. This ambulance would be used in part for COVID-19 responses including transports and transfers. We average 2-3 transfer calls daily to surrounding areas such as Salt Lake and Utah Counties. In corresponding with the State EMS Director Guy Dansie, he said eligible expenditures include but are not limited to emergency medical response expenses, including emergency medical transportation related to COVID-19. With the increased costs to the District with COVID expenses, the purchase of a transport ambulance would have a big impact on the district financially. We have included a copy of the quote for the ambulance as well as a copy of how much it would cost to stock it. During this pandemic and uncertain times, it would be extremely beneficial to the district if any assistance is offered. We appreciate your consideration and time.

Clair,

Thank you for your time last week. It was good to meet some of your crew.

Regarding a Type II ambulance, the standard model price without alteration or customization would be approximately \$94,500 on the Ford Transit AWD chassis. If you stayed with a front wheel drive it would save you approximately \$4,500.

I have included the standard floor plan drawings. There is a High Roof model (HR) that adds 10 inches to the ceiling height, and there is an optional locking cabinet (labeled "option B" on the diagram) on the bulkhead. I threw in a Sprinter floor plan for comparison.

I spoke to the factory about a turnout cabinet. It is possible to remove the shelving on the bulkhead and turn that space into a turnout cabinet. The driver side cabinets are not very deep but we could look at options there.

If you would like to further explore the Type II option, we can get together and go over the drawings and get a formal quote put together from the factory.

Regarding lead times, the last posted lead time on the Mercedes Chassis was 28 weeks. The Mercedes does *not* have a 4x4 option because it becomes too heavy. The Ford Sprinter AWD (All Wheel Drive) Mid Roof is 12 weeks, and the High Roof is 24 weeks.

All three car manufacturers have restarted their production as of 5/18/2020. They are all still publishing a 28-week lead time for a new chassis.

Mayor Johnson,

I apologize if this is too late but I just got the final info on the Fire District's purchases. Wasatch County is using it's CARES allocation to cover the following:

- COVID calls for EMS crews – as of the end of July this amounts to over \$80 thousand of expenses
- PPE for the FIRE District – including advanced protective equipment for EMS crews around \$30 thousand
- Cleaning equipment for Fire stations – around \$50 thousand
- Critical equipment to reduce COVID risks – just over \$375 thousand

If you'd like a more detailed breakdown of the equipment we're purchasing, let me know.
