WHY ARE FAMILIES STRUGGLING TO LIVE HERE?



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
1 in 5 Utah Children Go Hungry Everyday. 12.3% of Children in Wasatch County Live in Poverty which equates to 1,068 youth.



Wasatch County has over 600 elementary schools kids, 111 middle school kids and an undetermined number of high school youth who face food insecurity everyday.



Why? With low-paying jobs, expensive housing (medium home price \$444,000.00) only two affordable housing units (with wait lists up to 3 years), no public transportation and many leaving the county for work. Families skimp and scrape and hope that food will last until the next payday.

- •40% of Americans had trouble paying for food, medical care, housing, or utilities in the last year.
- •Nearly half of Americans have no retirement savings, creating increases in stress-related illnesses and heart disease.
- •63% of Americans do not have \$500 of cash on hand to handle emergencies or other significant expenses.
- •70% of college grads have \$15,000 or more of loans outstanding in their first year of work.

4 in 10 Americans now have a "sides hustle" to make more money to help make ends meet Employers like Wal-Mart, McDonald's, Ubers, and Outback Steakhouse are now building programs to pay people every day, so they can better manage their cash.

Companies Are Sitting On Cash But Not Raising Wages


Community Action Services and Food Bank served 2,888 individuals or families in 2018.

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WHAT'S BEING DONE TO HELP OUR RESIDENTS AND FAMILIES IN NEED?

- WCSA launched "Healing Hunger Here Campaign" to address childhood hunger by making food more available to our youth. We established the High School food pantry and Middle School food closets. We supported weekend nutrition packs and are developing programs to provide food during school breaks.
- The Bishops Warehouse was approached by us and they agreed to support local food pantries.
- Transient and Indigent Assistance Brochure was updated and Law Enforcement trained on community resources.
- Rural Economic Development Incentive (REDI) program has launched to incentivize businesses to create jobs with higher wages.
- Possible collaboration with Park City Transit for transportation services.
