Good Morning,

I hope you all are doing well and enjoying the summer months.

We are close around the corner of school starting and want to address a concern I have expressed to most of you many times and yet have come to a solution. Now an article came out on KSL yesterday regarding school zones and cross walks.

Mitchie Lane now has been complete for almost a year. During its construction, we, the neighborhoods had expressed the need to draw attention to the intersection of 300 South and Mitchie Lane. The 4-way Stop is an added benefit to the kids going to school, playing in the neighborhoods and crossing the streets on their bikes. Since the roads completion, we have expressed a serious need to control the speeding traffic on Mitchie Lane. On a daily basis, the stop signs going East to West are constantly run through at all ranges of speeds without stopping. We have had friends over, neighbors watch, and out of town guests comment on how unlawfully people drive on Mitchie Lane. We have seen large trucks pulling trailers, boats, hay, construction trailers not only drive through the stop signs, but never even slow down. We see teenagers speed through with their friends. We see adults that live in the area speed through at all times of the day without slowing down or coming to a complete stop. We have even seen city vehicles and contractors working in the area speed through the signs without stopping. We have even asked Law enforcement to monitor it one day to show their is a serious concern.

As school goes back in to affect, something has to be done. We have recommended for over a year better markings on the roads, calling out a STOP ahead, lines drawn on the road calling out the 4-way Stop, the cross walk, and School area crossing. We have requested speed bumps or a dip in the road to slow traffic.

Please consider enhancing the attention to the Stop area before an accident occurs. I would like to address the City Council in open forum regarding this matter. I hope to be able to.
