Reference is made to a site visit by (b) (6) of my staff on April 3, 1991, to your property (Swiss Paradise Lot #15) located north of State Highway 113 and west of River Road in Section 35, Township 3 South, Range 4 East, northeast of Midway, Wasatch County, Utah.

Your project has been reviewed in accordance with Section 404 of the Clean Water Act under which the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers regulates the discharge of dredged and fill material into waters of the United States including wetlands. Based on the information provided and an onsite inspection by Ms. (b) (6) of this office, this site does contain wetland areas. This jurisdictional determination has been verified using the 1987 Corps of Engineers Wetland Delineation Manual. We have enclosed a copy of a map showing the wetland areas. A Department of the Army permit would be required to place fill in these wetlands.

The wetland boundaries may change depending on permanent changes in the hydrologic regime. This wetland mapping is valid until September 30, 1996.



Dear Mr. Finucan:

Reference is made to your application of December 16, 1991, regarding the placement of fill material into 0.06 acre of wetlands adjacent to an unnamed tributary to the Provo River on Swiss Paradise Lot 7 for construction of a home, garage and driveway. The site is located in Section 35, Township 3 South Range 4 East in Midway, Wasatch County, Utah.

Your project has been reviewed in accordance with Section 404 of the Clean Water Act under which the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers regulates the discharge of dredged and fill material into waters of the United States including wetlands. Based on the information provided, it appears that your project would involve such discharges.

Nationwide Permit Number 26, described on the enclosed information sheet, has been issued which authorizes the discharge of dredged or fill material into waters and wetlands which are above the headwaters. Your project would involve work in these wetlands and is authorized under this nationwide permit. This nationwide general permit eliminates the need for further processing for discharges which affect less than one acre of the above-mentioned waters. The only requirement is that the person responsible for the project must insure that the work complies with the conditions and best management practices listed on the enclosure. Failure to satisfy these conditions invalidates the authorization and may result in a violation of the Clean Water Act.

New nationwide permit regulations will take effect on January 21, 1992. Your project will continue to be authorized under these new regulations. Please note that there will be a temporary lapse in nationwide permit authorization between January 12 and January 21, 1992, and no construction will be allowed during that period. This verification that your project is authorized by a nationwide permit is valid for two years.

Our determination of authorization under the nationwide permit is based upon your proposed mitigation for the loss of wetlands in the form of enhancement of 0.12 acre of wetlands by creation of a 1,000 square foot pond and planting of trees and shrubs, as per your plan dated December 16, 1991. The mitigation area, as per your agreement, will be placed in a deed restriction on this lot by attaching a copy of this permit to the deed.
