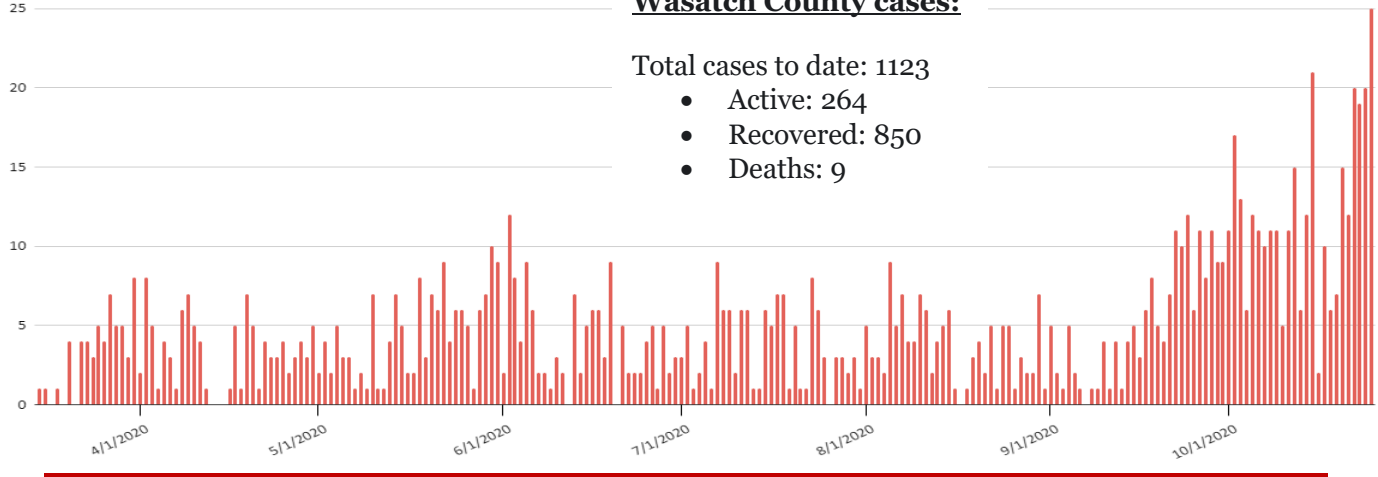

### Wasatch County cases:

Total cases to date: 1123

- Active: 264
- Recovered: 850
- Deaths: 9



### Wasatch County Transmission Index Metrics:

Transmission Level:	<b>High</b>
7-day average percent positivity:	<b>12.7%</b>
14-day case rate per 100,000:	<b>421.2</b>
Statewide total ICU utilization:	<b>72.2%</b>
Statewide covid-19 ICU utilization:	<b>18.2%</b>

#### High Level Indicators:

- ≥ 13% 7-day average % positivity
- ≥ 325/100k 14-day case rate
- ≥ 72% total utilization and ≥ 15% COVID-19 Statewide ICU utilization (7-day average)

### October 23 GOVERNOR GARY R. HERBERT

“This is a record day for Utah — but not a good one. Cases of COVID-19 are at an all-time high, and I am deeply concerned that COVID exhaustion is as well. Now is not the time to let down your guard. By public health order, masks are required in 21 counties. Wear one any time you are around someone outside your immediate household, even when around extended family and friends.

Up until now, our hospitals have been able to provide good care to all COVID and non-COVID patients who need it. But today we stand on the brink. If Utahns do not take serious steps to limit group gatherings and wear masks, our healthcare providers will not have the ability to provide quality care for everyone who needs it.”

A transmission level (high, moderate, low) is determined if a county has two of the three metrics in the designated level of transmission. Data will be analyzed weekly, and counties will be placed into a transmission level depending solely on what their data show. Changes from a lower level to a higher level may occur weekly. Changes from a higher level to a lower level may occur every 14 days at minimum when thresholds are met.
