



Dr. Erik Christensen, State of Utah Chief Medical Examiner: "Everyday at the Office of the Medical Examiner there are harsh reminders of the seriousness of this disease. I see first-hand the devastating impacts it has on those who are left behind. Let me be clear, these deaths are preventable. None of the individuals who we determine to have died from COVID-19 would have suffered this fate at the time they did had they not been infected with COVID-19."

Gov. Herbert's Press briefing: - Dr. Clark Bishop (Critical care and pulmonary medicine physician from Intermountain's Utah Valley Hospital in Provo) shared his experiences treating those with COVID-19 and he appeals to Utahns to wash hands, wear masks and maintain distancing.

Coronavirus vs Flu: Symptoms are similar

Symptoms of coronavirus and influenza are similar. Moving into flu season it is important to GET A FLU SHOT and to get tested for COVID-19 when exhibiting symptoms. Testing is critical to pandemic response to identify positive cases, to slow the spread, and to understand the state of the pandemic in order to take appropriate actions.

Statement from Heber Valley Hospital about testing: With the increase of COVID-19 positive cases and the increase in the number of people seeking testing Intermountain Healthcare recommends that you call the COVID-19 Hotline to register. The number is 801-442-5445. We recognize there is a wait on the COVID-19 testing line as well as at the testing site. You can use the Call Back feature and Intermountain Healthcare will call you back rather than place you on hold. If you have a difficult time you can reach out to your primary care provider. This is a state-wide issue that we are working to improve every day.
